At each of the CoWs I came away with the impression





REPORT FROM THE D28 RULES COMMITTEE

The D28 Rules Committee is nearing the end of updating the Bylaws. The committee started its process with research, as is customary every few years in USPS.

The committee consists of **P/D/C Adriaan Veldhuisen** as the Chair, **Commander Allan Bombard**, and **P/D/C Richard Cross**.

Notes for this draft:

- 1. This draft is based on the USPS District Model Bylaws of October 2022.
- 2. All accepted changes were made in the previous D28 Bylaws of September 2021`.
- 3. Editing is incorporated based on Grammarly, a cloud-based spelling checker.
- 4. The goal of these changes is based on simplifying D28's organizational structure.
- 5. The [OPTIONAL] existence of a District Council has been eliminated.
- 6. Per December 1, District 28 consists of only 3 squadrons, all in southern California.
- 7. The functions of the Secretary and Treasurer are combined into one office.
- 8. Furthermore, we may consider whether Elected Assistants should be [OPTIONAL].
- 9. If the offices of Exec and Admin are eliminated, then their responsibilities need 'a home'.

<u>Our process</u>: We downloaded the latest USPS District Model Bylaws and examined our changed environment. To that end, the committee has downloaded the newest Model Bylaws for Districts from USPS Headquarters. **We are the first, or one of the first districts, to use the District Model Bylaws**. We also reviewed the current D28 Bylaws. We sought input from the District Commander, the Secretary/Treasurer, and others.

We cycled our questions and proposals several times for further review and input through the **USPS National Rules Committee** and ultimately updated the draft documents as proposed new Bylaws. Our latest review from our USPS Advisor was that our proposed Bylaws *look fine*! To us, that meant that we could bring the process we initiated for a vote.

The committee requests that members of D28 review the proposed Bylaws, as distributed with the **Lead Line** (attached to your email). There will be an opportunity to make comments at the **2023 District 28 Conference on March 25**, with motions for Amendment, upon which a vote will be taken to adopt them as the current District 28 Bylaws.

I'm optimistic that 2023 will be even better than 2022 with a full bridge and lots of enthusiasm.











It is important to note that even though the program is called the Dockwalker Program, ABC/USPS members <u>do not necessar-</u> <u>ily</u> have to walk the docks in order to reach out to boaters because **Dockwalking** (conducting face-to-face education and distributing the boater kits accompanied with education) <u>can</u> <u>be done wherever boaters are</u>, including:

- Boating facilities (marinas, yacht clubs)
- Boat launch ramps
- Fishing piers
- Boat shows
- Boating events
- Boating classes
- And as mentioned above, while conducting VEs, boating safety and navigation classes, ABC/USPS public education events and presentations

D28 Safety Report The Dangers of Wind/Current

Wind and current affect every move a boat makes in the water. Depending on what you're trying to do on the water, these two major factors can be your enemy as well your friend. A lack of understanding of how they affect your maneuverability can result in dangerous situations for you and others.


The most common example is found in departing from and arriving at a dock. Every so often, you may observe a less experienced captain struggle to maintain control when docking in the wind. This is because wind pushes

against any and all surface area of a vessel above the waterline. The lighter your vessel is, the more its movement is affected. However, it is possible to use these potentially hazardous variables to your advantage. The key is to avoid positioning your vessel at an angle where the wind is pushing it away from the dock. While using the wind to pin your vessel



against the platform is optimal, there are techniques to get your vessel safely docked if the elements are not in your favor.

Pulling up to a dock with wind pushing you away from it is



achievable when utilizing your vessels full potential. To tie up at a safe and parallel angle, attach a line to one side of the bow. Then, turn your wheel away from the dock and apply forward thrust. This maneuver will swing the stern

towards the dock and allows for a safe tie-up.

This is just one example of understanding the effects of wind as well as when and how to apply your boating skills. I write this hoping that I have inspired some of you to practice and inquire about on-the-water HOT (Hands-On-Training) courses at your nearest **America's Boating Club**[®] location.

UNITED STATES POWER SQUADRONS

District 28 of USPS is made up of squadrons from Arizona and California. The D28 flag design is based on combining elements and symbolism from the state flags of those two states.

The white background on the top half of the D-28 flag with the five pointed red star on the top left area comes directly from the California state flag, having the same proportion and placement. (*Historically, The Lone Star Flag of California contained a single red star on a white background*.)

The copper star on the top right area comes from the center of the Arizona state flag, but reduced in size to match the red star and is placed symmetrically to the red star. (The copper star of the flag identifies Arizona as the largest copper producing state in the union.)

The red horizontal stripe on the bottom is taken directly from the California flag. It is placed on the blue horizontal stripe taken from the Arizona flag. The blue and red stripes on the bottom are separated by a white line, symbolizing the Colorado River between the two states.

The gold twenty-eight stars in an array around the center of the flag designates that this is the flag of district twenty-eight of the USPS.

The flag and its heraldry were approved by the national Flag and Etiquette Committee and announced at the USPS 2009 Annual Meeting, 21 February 2009

The 50th Anniversary Gold border was approved on 9 December 2013. So this is our 60th Year!
